**S**ingapore Philatelic Museum was pleased to assist The Fullerton Heritage Singapore to set up a permanent gallery at its premises. The exhibition showcased the history and heritage of the Fullerton Building.

Archival photographs, old maps, picture postcards, and postal artefacts were used to trace the development of Fullerton Building from the period before it was built, its construction in the 1920s, its use as a General Post Office and government offices such as the Inland Revenue Department, and the current efforts to preserve the heritage buildings in the area.

The Fullerton Heritage Gallery was officially opened on 8 July 2010 by Mr Lui Tuck Yew, Acting Minister for the Ministry of Information, Communications and the Arts.
